Youth Group Update





If you were at Hemantika 2021, you will remember the 'Kathak girls with Attitude' – yes, the youth group at SBDC is full of energy, attitude and excitement to make Kathak a part of their Gen Z lives. At SBDC, the Indian classical dance tradition of handing down learning from the guru/mentor is practised in its true spirit – it is a way of coaching and shaping young minds to think freely, be creative and stay rooted in the classical form through discipline and Riyaz (practice). The Youth Group was started by Sujatadi a few years back and this year it received Arts Council funding to become a structured programme for dance development. Sujatadi is a leading voice in the UK to advocate for investment in creating dance career pathways, and for her a structured programme for young dancers is just the springboard that the sector needs to engage and motivate young dancers!



The youth group members are an enthusiastic bunch of 11-14 years olds selected through auditions. On a regular weekly session, you will find them practising a performance piece, doing a creative session with Sujatadi or learning hip hop or flamenco. It is a wonderful space for them to bond, connect and work together for performances. It was an honour for the group to perform Mangalam at the centenary celebrations of Pt Ravi Shankar at Southbank Centre and on 5th June, they performed with English National Ballet's youth group to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee, Watch this space for more exciting news about the youth group!
